## Staff:

Smt Gayatri Bhardwaj (DIP Nursery TTrg) has been acting class teacher since November 09 and working very well with the Primary-junior group.

On 7th September 2010 Deepa Bajaj Lachwani was appointed as a part time Occupational Therapist Roshni is still trying to appoint a male helper for students to help in daily activities including lifting and carrying. One candidate came but had an asking rate starting at Rs 1500.00, but there has been no one in the post since November 2009, even with an increased amount of Rs 2000/-.

The staff went for a picnic on the 7th February 2011 to the Chambal Ghariyal Reserve Park. 19 members of staff travelled to the Chambal River and went on a river boat to see the crocodiles and alligators and later had packed lunch at the Conservation Unit near Morena. Dr RJ RAo , Jiwaji University, helped us in organising this interesting trip This acted as both a team building exercise and an exploratory visit to see if the trip would be suitable for students to attend in the future. It was also a treat by FOR UK as a Christmas present.

### **Staff Training:**

3 teachers from Roshni, Shubha Kanda, Renuka Shrivastav and Gayatri Bhardwaj,and Rakhi Asthana, Principal and Deepa Lachhwani OT and 2 mothers attended the training on Dyslexia in August and the CRE-Continued Rehabilitation Education on Early identification and treatment of Autism Spectrum Disorders held from 9th to 13th December 2010. Smt Patankar and Smt Ghatak attended the Knowledge workshop of the National Trust on the 9th September 2010 Rakhi Asthana attended the Census training on 15th January 2011 in Delhi and Bhopal 15 Feb 2011

#### Volunteers:

Smt Aruna Singh has been coming to ROSHNI since July 2009 as a volunteer Assistant Teacher every day and we would now like to give her an honorarium/travel allowance. Smt. Priti Kumar has now been coming since July 2010; she was to help to take a class in 2011, but her husband has been transferred to Allahabad and thus will not be available; a class teacher is required for the Prevocational class; we have a mother volunteer in mind, who can come regularly from mid- March 2011. Smt Sarita Agrawal has also started volunteering 3 days in the Junior Primary Class, supporting Gayatri with children such as Saksham and Karan.

Mr Mike and Mrs Anna Lunn Volunteer couple from Roshni UK, arrived at Gwalior on 8th October 2010 as volunteer placement for 8 months. They have been working very sincerely and have also accompanied the students of ROSHNI to the National Anjali Children Festival in Orissa. Mrs Lunn is a Physiotherapist experienced with older disabled persons and her husband, Mike Lunn a Recruitment and development specialist for NHS & Co-operative organisations, a Post Graduate from Leeds University, UK, is assisting Roshni with organizational development and planning. They will be with us till the 9th April 2011. Physiotherapist Volunteers fresh graduates -Shanta Kumar and Keeley Jones arrived on 22 January 2011 and will also be here till April 3rd week. Their focus is on utilizing orthotics stocks with greater efficiency, working with autistic people to increase their access to education and sensory play.

Therapy: In the Therapy department the staff comprises- 2 Developmental therapists, 1 Part time Occupational Therapist & 3 PT volunteers from UK and 2 Assistant therapists, who see regular students and OPD cases 6 days. The 7 regular Autistic children at Roshni are given Sensory Integration Therapy and Activities to enhance Gross Motor and Fine Motor Skills by the Occupational and Developmental Therapist and sp educator. Primary: The regular students with Autism at Roshni are given Sensory Integration Therapy and Activities to enhance Gross Motor and Fine Motor Skills and assessed and worked with 9 Primary Students for ADLs by the Occupational and Developmental Therapist.

21st July / 25th- November- 5 Primary School Students were assessed by Ms Aparna Bhonsle for Speech & Communication, some of them had been seen earlier in March 2010.

8th-17th Nov 2010: -Anjali National Children Festival, Orissa; 5 Vocational and 2 Primary Students including Ashok, Balgram, one sibling (Muskan's sister) with Smt Ghatak and Smt Gayatri Bhardwaj and 2 volunteers Anna & Mike Lunn, from ROSHNI UK.

6 Students from the primary group and 20 Students from Vocational group participated in a Christmas Party in Roshni for which we invited Shri & Smt C A Mandhre (Donors).

The Primary project was on various types of shops and they had a couple of visits shopping for fruit and vegetable and visited the Mela too.

The Primary Grp students -9 and 5 Voc Students who had not been out station, had an overnight trip ,to observe their ADLs and have a night away from parents for most of these students it was their first night away from their home or parents. The evening included games and activities followed by a three course meal and disco at the Central Park Hotel. They had dinner at the Central Park Hotel. The following

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morning a trip of 12 students and 14 staff members went to the Chambal river to complete the trip. went to the Chambal Ghariyal Reserve Park , boating on the Chambal river and saw the Ghariyal conservation at the Ghariyal Centre at Morena on February 22/23/2011. This was a very good experience for students and the escorts.

We have approached the Central Park Hotel for taking them on for certain jobs.

Roshni vocational group managed a stall at Shilp Bazaar for 10 days, and had a stall together with the Mrignaynee at the Shilp Bazaar at the Mela in Dec and January 2011

Mothers and students helped the staff to man the stall, daily. this provided the group with the opportunity to sell their products to an increased number of customers. During the sales period the team took in ... Rs sales, the majority of the profits will be passed directly to the vocational students.

The Vocational group ran a stall at the Junior Round Square Conference at Scindia School on the 5th March as part of Friends Everywhere Conference mentioned below.

Outstation Educational Trip: 7th –10th March . 12 young adults of the Vocational Unit and 6 escorts including a mother, had a 3-4day visit to Bhopal. Arushi Bhopal helped with the arrangements for their

stay and sightseeing to Sanchi and Bhimbetka and the Museum of Mankind at Bhopal. Both the trips were funded largely by FoR UK and parents contribution.

## **Early Intervention:**

Early Intervention group which was run once a week on Tuesdays was increased to 2 days (Tues/Fridays) since Feb 2011 and different topics were covered for infants. The New OT Smt Deepa Lachwani is seeing the hand functions, Sensory Issues and ADL's problem children with special needs programme made and hand over to parents. The PT volunteer Mrs Anna Lunn also assessed children with CP and delayed milestones with the Vivek Sharma in groups. Group Sessions – In the group we covered the different themes:

July Concepts – pre Maths /Pre Reading with Water-play and Rainy season,

August Body Image

**September** Domestic and Wild life Animals

October Sensory integration – Tactile senses; we used Tac pack method which helps children to use their sensory feedback development for their learning different concepts of early learning and to use develop their abilities.

**Nov /Dec** Festivals esp Christmas and activities such as painting and collage work in a grp

From May to September 2010 EI group 5 children attended Halliwick Swimming therapy method used by Vivek Sharma with coaches at LNUPE Gwalior which is run by Swimaid.

Jan -March the new PT Volunteers Shanta and Keeley introduced messy play in sensory integration and some other new activities and students have enjoyed them. Some of the themes included 'Under the Sea' which incorporated sand and water play, and sessions have been planned for rainforest and disco theme. The aim of the sessions are to enable children to access new learning experience which they otherwise have been unable to access due to their disability; the sessions also help to develop social skills and concentration, as well as addressing sensory issues. The team also has a plan to cover ADL's and Oral motor issues in greater detail during our group activities. The first week in the March covered dressing/undressing, Feeding and other basic area of daily living skills.

Ms Aparna Bhonsle Speech & Language Therapist conducted workshop for Speech and Language in Early Intervention Group April 2011. Total 7 parents attended and she assessed the two children and made the program and handover to staff and parents to follow next 3 months.

## **Training:**

On 6th April 2010 Teachers Training organized for the primary school teachers and the topic was Activity Based learning for primary teachers. Smt Alaukikaraje Khachar Head Mistress Rajkumar College, Rajkot. Gujerat. Total of 20 teachers participated from local schools and also rural area Govt schools teacher.

DIET training From the 5th -16th April the lecture for the Govt School teachers in Samudan Dabra by Mrs Manjula Patankar and Ram Sevak and total 18 teachers attended. Mr Vivek Sharma & Mrs Renuka Shrivastava delivered a lecture on 9th at Samudan Dabra & Antri and Mr Vivek Sharma took the lead on the 16th April 2010 training given for the teachers Maharani school, Gwalior for 30 teachers.

Mrs Manjula Patankar attended the International Conference on Early Detection & Assessment of Autism held in Delhi by Tamanna, at the Habitat Centre. On the 7th there was the Inauguration and 8th/9th & 10th/11th workshop was attended by Ramsevak Bareiya who is autism Trainer / BDTherapsist.

From the 23rd to 24th April 2010 Mrs Rakhi Asthana attended meeting regarding the amended PWD act 95 in NAB, Mumbai, MH.

5th – 7th July 2010 Mr V Sharma conducted a 3 day workshop on training & assessment of children with CP, assessed the Cp children and handed over programme to parents and staff at St Francis home, Pathankot, Punjab. This initiative was funded by Voice & Vision, Mumbai. The event was networking between ROSHNI, Voice & Vision and St Francis Home to help provide support and assistance from ROSHNI specialists. The workshop was attended by 15 students & 11 staff members of that NGO.

Shri V Sharma attended and lectured the Master Trainers Training Programme at LNUPE Gwalior from 20th – 24th July 2010. The PYAKA trainers & Special Olympics, Bharat team were the resource person.

Shri V Sharma delivered a lecture on the Halliwick Concept to the team of Master training PYAKA at LNUPE Gwalior on 29th Aug 10.

On the 10th August Teachers training on Dyslexia Management Volkarts was conducted by Dr Vivek Sharma at ROSHNI, Smt Deepa Lachhwani (OT) assisted. 25 participants / teachers from NGOs & Mainstream school attended the training. The Guests were Dr Mukul Tiwari, Director Apex Hospital, Ex President IAP & IMA and State level committees of IMA & Smt Ramesh Sharma, President Mahila Shanti Sena & retd Prof in Govt College, Gwalior.

DIET training for the Govt School teachers of Dabra, Bhitarwar and Ghatigaon, by Mr V Sharma delivered a lecture on 27<sup>th</sup> to 30<sup>th</sup> & Mrs Manjula Patankar on 29th & 30th December at DIET Training Centre, Gwalior - 30-40 teachers. On 2nd July 2010 and 8th February 2011 Smt Manjula Patankar attended the School Management Committee Meeting of the Army Public School Gwalior as she has been invited to be a member of the Executive Committee of that school.

A visit from Mrs Jagjit Pavadia, the Narcotics Commissioner of India on the 21st January for an extended art session as a the preparation for work from students of ROSHNI to be put together to make a calendar for the Narcotics Bureau of India, to promote and distribute as part of its corporate social responsibility requirements. The students were given the broad theme of plants to work with and the completed calendars will be distributed all over the country and abroad and to ROSHNI in the coming financial year.

17 September -A program of parent training to engage parents in vocational work on information about the National Trust & ARUNIM plan about treating Vocational work as a business,; the Ma Sharada Mothers' Group to further develop as an SHG that could help in organizing regular Vocational work so that the students who have received training could begin to earn regularly.

They were informed about a proposal for a new Economic Enterprise and Empowerment challenge (E3) The Economic Enterprise and empowerment challenge has been devised by The National Trust to encourage microfinance initiatives in NGO's across India. The initial Expression on interest and Application form were submitted in November 2010.

Mike Lunn and Mrs Devyani Halway (a parent of one of the students) attended the training on 20th & 21st December on "how to write a proposal". to develop business proposals to be entered into the E3 competition.

The two - day training covered the development of a product or service to meet demand from customers or dients. It also explored customer profiling and ensuring that customer demand is explored and exploited. The Maa Sarada Mothers Group has now submitted a proposal with the support of Mike Lunn Volunteer Friends of Roshni, UK to be considered in this competition, the prize for which will include financial support and professional services from large funding organisations. The proposal was submitted by the parents group in December/January .They were in the 3rd position for their proposal on Jewellery-making, which is a great credit to them and their hard work.

This will hopefully lead to funding for the vocational unit to be more enterprising with the support of the parents group in the future.

With Mike's help we hope to help the parents to register as Parent Association to conduct the residential scheme of the national trust and support parents in Need.

National Trust- Advocacy meeting with disability commissioner & LLC meeting at Collector office Gwalior on 24th April 2010 and meeting attended by Collector Mr Akash Tripathi ,Mrs Disha Nagvanshi JD panchyat Mrs Manjula Patankar LLC member, Mr M L Malhotra member from Parents, Mr Harish Jaiswal recommended member of LLC Gwalior. The main issue was legal Guardianship and the problem with disability Certificates & BPL cards for the disabled children parents despite the one window system. Meeting were also held on 2nd June2010,31st July 2010 and 17th feb 2011 regarding Census Participation Rally

On 10th to 12th May 2010 Workshop Organisational Development and Capacity Building for NGOs-at Gwalior. The resource person for the training is Mr Michael J. Rosenkrantz, Consultant & VSO Volunteer at the National Trust. New Delhi.

Roshni was a National Trust State Nodal Agency and thus NGO representatives were invited from 10 districts Morena, Bhind, Datia, Shivpuri, Guna, Ashok Nagar, Tikamgarh, Chhattarpur, Sheopur, and Gwalior, as well as other parts of Madhya Pradesh and neighboring states of UP and Rajasthan. There are 43 participants from local and outstation NGOs from Gwalior & Chambal Region and Madhya Pradesh and from Agra, Lucknow, Banda and Varanasi, in Uttar Pradesh. National Trust - CRE Training on Early Identification and Intervention for Autism Spectrum from 9th - 13th December 2010. This training was attended by 35 professionals from different NGO's from Madhya Pradesh and UP.

The National Trust Proposal (attached) we feel there is a growing need for respite and residential care and are applying for the 'Gharaunda scheme for which funds would be made available if a building could be made to provide for adults who require it for 12 persons.

**Fund Raising:** Fund raising meetings at SBI Bhopal was also planned- Efforts were made with the State Bank of India and Indore to provide an adapted bus for the physically disabled adult students, We had the support of smt Manju Iyengar and have received Rs 10,00,000/-, it is in the pipeline but some unforeseen delays have occurred. We hope to have a special event as an Annual Day this year during the presentation of this bus.

Mrs Daisy Bapuna assisted in getting a donation from Shri and Smt CA Mandhre for Rs 1 lac, in memory of their sister Lt Shakuntala Mandhre. They donated a LCD projector for the training Unit aand have initiated a 3 Annual scholarships 2 for students and one for a staff member with the interest from a FD for Rs 50,000; this year it was awarded to Tanvi khan Primary , Ankur Tomar Prevocational and Smt R Asthana ,Principal on the 15th August 2010.

Singapore visit- October- Nov 2010 by M Patankar a PP presentation was made and some donations received also an interest in joining to support various activities including /vocational item sales.

21st Nov a major Event- Airtel Delhi Half Marathon participation by 3 staff, 1 Volunteer M Patankar, Mike Lunn, Renuka Shrivastava, Col HCS Rawat collectively raised approximately Rs 1 Lac 35 thousand.

2 more salaries support from Mrs P Kapoor and Ms Aparna Bhonsle

Roshni UK has raised the £12,000 for the \$taff salaries we have received Rs 8,41,963/-in 2010 and further support in April to cover the salary increments.

Friends of Roshni UK set a target of £12,000 for service delivery in 2010, which they were delighted to reach. This money made a difference and enabled Roshni to continue to function effectively, while new sources of funds were sourced. The main support this year has been the Honorarium for staff and the Child sponsorships of 25 students of all ages. **H&H for Handicapped USA** has shown an interest in meeting the  $\Box$  activity for the year 2010-2011 and also to provide some funds for the Phase 2 of the building. The plan for the Building is ready, but we can only go ahead, when we have some more funds available. Smt Patankar met Dr Modak, one of the major contributing members from the organisation, in Pune in February 2011.

The Rotary Gub is to be approached for support of the Home Management programme, so that some activities get separate funding and function as a separate Unit.

State Bank Of India, has given us a funding for a special adapted bus in November 2011. There was a delay and we hope that this bus will be delivered in the new financial year.
